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1 and 2 Introduction and purpose

Redgate Primary Academy follows all aspects set out in the DAT policy. In addition to this Redgate Primary Academy strongly believe that every child is entitled to receive Sex and Relationship Education regardless of ethnicity, gender, religion, age, culture, disability, sexuality, language, special educational needs or whether they are disadvantaged or looked after children. It is our intention at Redgate Primary School that all our pupils have the opportunity to experience a programme of Sex and Relationship Education which is appropriate for their level of understanding and physical development.

3 and 4 Roles and Responsibilities

Redgate Primary Academy follows all roles and responsibilities set out in the DAT policy. In addition to this the people who are responsible for the Sex and Relationship Policy at Redgate Primary Academy are the Governors, the Executive Principal and the PSHE Co-Ordinator. It is the responsibility of the class teachers to meet the needs of their class. Redgate Primary Academy may seek advice from external agencies such as health care professionals to assist staff with the delivery of SRE.

5 Aims and Objectives

Redgate Primary Academy follows all aims and objectives set out in the DAT policy. In addition, the provision of Sex and Relationships Education at Redgate Primary Academy should help all pupils understand their physical and emotional development and enable them to make positive decisions in their lives. The DFEE (2000) state that schools require a graduated, age – appropriate programme of sex and relationship education. Teaching methods at Redgate Primary Academy will take into account the developmental differences of pupils. Due to the individual needs of our pupils; sex and relationships education needs to be specific to the needs and level of ability of each individual. The sex and relationship education programme acknowledges that students mature at their own speed and individual plans will be developed, delivered and monitored following their individual developmental and physical stages.

6 Content and Organisation

Redgate Primary Academy follows the content and organisation of SRE as defined in the DAT policy. However, when teaching Sex and Relationship Education at Redgate Primary Academy teachers will consider three main elements: Attitudes and Values, Personal and Social skills and Knowledge and understanding. Teachers will need to take into consideration the individual needs of our students. They will plan a variety of activities which will help to engage boys as well as girls, matching different learning styles with individual needs. Teachers may decide to teach certain lessons in a whole class context. However, teachers may find that they have to be more explicit to meet the individual needs of our pupils.
