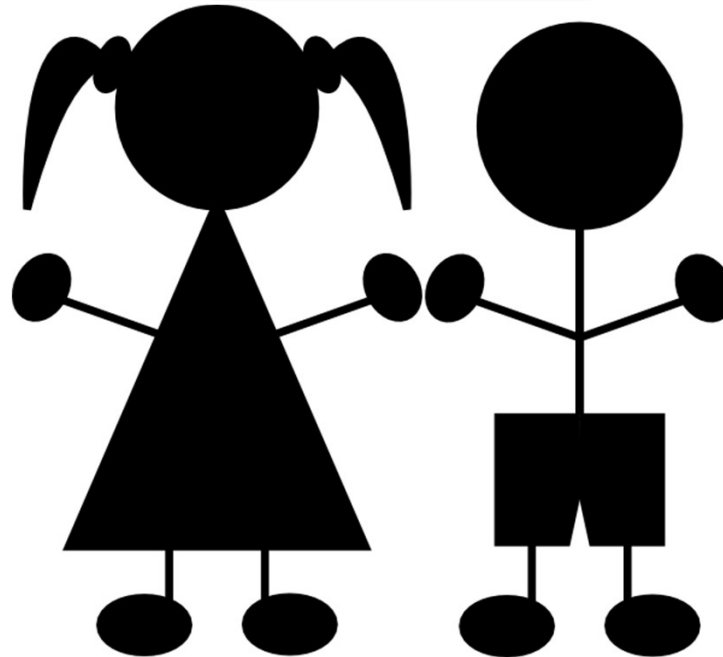

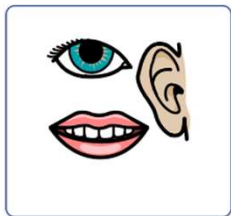

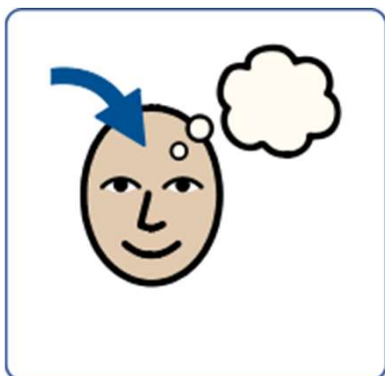




Our curriculum supports and enables children to be happy, resilient, independent and have a voice which is listened to



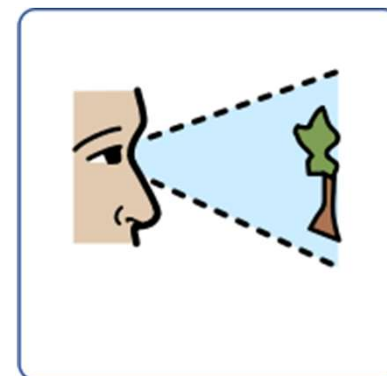
Which curriculum pathway is right my child?

What are our aims?



reading

- Your child will be able to listen and respond to familiar rhymes and stories
- Your child will be able to show some understanding of how a book works



writing

- Your child will be able to understand that marks and symbols have meaning



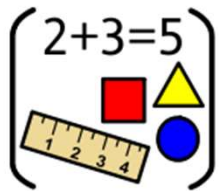
speaking

- Your child will be able to repeat and copy between 10 and 50 single words, phrases
- Your child will be able to understand at least 50 words including names for familiar objects

What are our aims?



maths

- Your child will be aware of number activities and counting
- Your child will know objects still exist when out of sight
- Your child will be able use mathematical skills in different activities



science

- Your child will be able to make simple observations



computing

- Your child will be able to explore different electronic devices and make something happen
- Your child will be able to work with an adult to keep themselves safe online

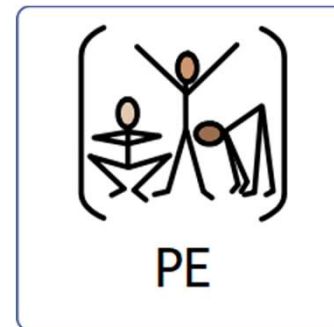
