It is a really exciting project and will make a huge difference to the learning environment for our students. Fortunately the impact of the building work has caused much less disruption than was initially expected.

As governors, we know how hard the staff and leaders work to provide a high standard of care, support and education. Learners follow a varied and exciting curriculum, ensuring all their unique needs remain at the very heart of everything both academies strive to achieve. During our regular visits to Yeoman Park and Redgate, governors have the opportunity to see this for ourselves. The children and young people at both academies are a delight, and it is a real privilege to talk to them and see their progress socially and academically.

It was a pleasure to visit the academies during parents evening and chat to some of you, and especially to hear such positive comments about the academy. We are looking forward to joining you again for the various nativities and Christmas concerts planned for the end of term and especially to joining the learners for Christmas dinner!
